how and when did the many schools of buddhism emerge how does the historical figure of siddhartha guatama relate to the many teachings that are presented in his name did buddhism modify the cultures to which it was introduced or did they modify buddhism leading buddhist scholar donald s lopez jr explores the origins of this 2 500 year old religion and traces its major developments up to the present focusing not only on the essential elements common to all schools of buddhism but also revealing the differences among the major traditions beginning with the creation and structure of the buddhist universe lopez explores the life of the buddha the core buddhist tenets and the development of the monastic life and lay practices combining brilliant scholarship with fascinating stories contemporary and historical sometimes miraculous sometimes humorous this rich and absorbing volume presents a fresh and expert history of buddhism and buddhist life

this short treatise explains in detail the principle of radical pluralism which asserts that the elements alone are realities while every combination of them is a mere name covering a plurality of separate elements the principle has been elucidated by its contrast with arambhavada which maintains the reality of the whole as well as of the elements and with parinama vada which ascribes absolute reality to the whole the work is divided into sixteen sections dealing with skandhas ayatanas dhatus elements of mind pratityasamutpada karma impermanence in sankhya yoga theory of cognition pre buddhaic buddhism etc it has two appendices dealing with the views of vasubandhu on the fundamental principles of sarvastivada and the classification of all elements of existence according to the sarvastivadins the two indices appended to the work record proper names and sanskrit terms occurring in the work

by chronicling how buddhism and psychotherapy shaped his own growth the author of going to pieces without falling apart has written an intimate chronicle of the evolution of spirit and psyche and presents a highly inviting guide for anyone seeking a new outlook on life

constituting communities explores how community functions within theravāda buddhist culture although the dominant focus of buddhist studies for the past century has been on doctrinal and philosophical issues this volume concentrates on discourses that produced them and why and how these discourses and practices shaped theravāda communities in south and southeast asia from a variety of perspectives

including historical literary doctrinal and philosophical and social and anthropological the contributors explore the issues that have proven important and definitive for identifying what it has meant individually and socially to be buddhist in this particular region the book focuses on textual discourse how communities are formed and maintained within pluralistic contexts and the formation of community both within and between the monastic and lay settings

this book examines the interface between buddhism and the caste system in india it discusses how buddhism in different stages from its early period to contemporary forms theravāda mahāyāna tantrayāna and navayāna dealt with the question of caste it also traces the intersections between the problem of caste with those of class and gender the volume reflects on the interaction between hinduism and buddhism it looks at critiques of caste in the classical buddhist tradition while simultaneously drawing attention to the radical challenge posed by dr b r ambedkar's navayāna buddhism or neo buddhism the essays in the book further compare approaches to varṇa and caste developed by modern thinkers such as m k gandhi and s radhakrishnan with ambedkar's criticisms and his departures from mainstream appraisals with its interdisciplinary methodology combining insights from literature philosophy political science and sociology the volume explores contemporary critiques of caste from the perspective of buddhism and its historical context by analyzing religion through the lens of caste and gender it also forays into the complex relationship between religion and politics while offering a rigorous study of the textual tradition of buddhism in india this book will be useful to scholars and researchers of indian philosophy buddhist studies indology literature especially sanskrit and pāli exclusion and discrimination studies history political studies women studies sociology and south asian studies

the buddhist monk buddhadasa bhikkhu 1906 1993 injected fresh life into thai buddhism by exploring and teaching little known transcendent aspects of the religion his investigations excited both monks and lay people and gave rise to the vigorous discussion in shops temple yards and newly founded buddhist associations moreover he was a prolific author who produced a rich array of publications that are indicative of his popularity and the impact of his teachings while these discussions included serious exchanges on doctrine and practice they also included jokes and light humor criticisms of weak evidence for certain positions and a defamation campaign arising from rumors that buddhadasa was a communist sympathizer buddhadasa's thoughts and historical context coincide with the general picture of modern buddhism and he may be seen as an agent of buddhist modernity but he worked predominantly in thailand through the medium of the thai language and he contributed much more significantly to thai buddhists than to buddhist practice outside the country an enormous amount of material relating to buddhadasa bhikkhu has been captured in religious journals and in numerous pocket books aimed at a general audience departing from the classical method of studying buddhism through philology tomomi ito's account of buddhadasa bhikkhu draws on this popular literature and on conversations with a broad spectrum of the people involved in these discussions to develop an account of buddhism as it is experienced by thai people the result is a lively intellectual and social history of contemporary thai religion and society built around the life of an exceptional monk who captured the interest of buddhists pursuing spiritual depth in the context of the ideological conflicts of the cold war

what kind of person should i strive to be what ideals should i pursue in my life these basic human questions and others like them are components of the overall question that guides this book what is enlightenment as dale wright argues any serious practitioner of human life religious or not confronts the challenge of living an authentic life of overcoming common human disabilities like greed hatred and delusion that give rise to excessive suffering why then wright asks is this essential question often avoided even discouraged among buddhists one reason frequently cited by buddhists is that pondering a

*distant goal might be a waste of energy that would be better applied to practice quiet the flow of obsessive thinking put yourself in a mindful state of presence and let enlightenment take care of itself in this book however wright contends that pondering this question is meditative practice that attentive inquiry of this kind is essential as the starting point and guide for any mindful practice of life meditative reflection on the meaning of enlightenment focuses us on our aim and direction in life it guides us in shaping our practices our ideals and the kinds of lives we will live asking what enlightenment is as a basic form of meditation helps to activate our lives and get transformative practice underway from wright's perspective there is no more important question to ask than this one what is buddhist enlightenment offers a wide ranging exploration of issues that have a bearing on the contemporary meaning of enlightenment including a concluding section with 10 theses that answer the title's question written by a leading scholar of buddhism the book balances deep learning and an accessible style offering valuable insights for students scholars and practitioners alike while he takes an examination of what enlightenment has been in past buddhist traditions as his point of departure wright's historical considerations yield to the question that our lives press upon us what kinds of lives should we aspire to live here now and into the future*
